

# **Prayer of Confession**

One: We come together in this time of prayer to bring before God our longings and dreams, our concerns and preoccupations, our secrets and our truths. In the company of friends and strangers, let us pray together, saying:

### **Responsive Reading**

Psalm 19

- <sup>1</sup> The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.
