

Sunday Niters Niters Although not an official arm of the church, Sunday Niters has been a part of this congregation since the time of Revs. Michael and Jane Henderson who were pastors at Plymouth UCC in the 1980's. It has endured ever since. With an occasional exception, we meet second and fourth Sunday evenings during "the off season" meaning not from mid-June into September. A potluck dinner is hosted by various members or friend of the church often accompanied by a program and at other times just for the sociability. All are welcome. Host venue volunteers and those to present programs are always being sought. On May 27th, we meet at Bob and Carol Stewart at the usual time with a high altitude dish. From Exit 28, take Route 49 into Waterville Valley for approx. 5 miles – just beyond "WV 5 Miles" sign, turn left on Upper Mad River Road (cross bridge) - approx. .7 miles past Gateway Townhouses to 3rd road on right, Orris - .6 miles to "T", parking lot on right – Bear left past Woodwinds sign – turn left at next "T" – then right at "Y" staying on Orris. We are 4th house on right, #262. Park in driveway or up the hill to area in front of house, 726-3535. No program announced. On **June 10th**, we meet at Bob and Carole Curry which is the last get together until September. Take exit 23 in New Hampton off of 93 - turn left and go under 93 to Old Bristol Road on right – take left onto Carter Mt. Road to the end at #234. Bring a dish.
