

Conference Minister Search Committee Recommends Reverend Gordon M. Rankin be Called as New Conference Minister

Special Meeting to be held August 4, 2018, in Laconia

The <u>Reverend Gordon M. Rankin</u> has been nominated to be the new Conference Minister. Read the <u>letter from Neal Cass, Chairperson of</u> <u>the ConferenceMinister Search Committee</u>.

Since Conference bylaws require election of a Conference Minister at a meeting of the Gathered Conference, and because the Annual Meeting in October contains a full agenda, the Board of Directors has authorized a special meeting for the purpose of calling the Rev. The special meeting will be held on Saturday, August 4, 2018, at Laconia Congregational Church, UCC, at 11 AM. (<u>Click here</u> for directions to the church.)
