

 of the church is available only to persons with limited mobility or physical

One: Open your hearts.

All: Our hearts are open to God's love.

One: Give thanks to God.

All: We are here to give God thanks and praise.

One: Summer days and wind rippling the surface of the water on Squam Lake, dogs with muddy feet, cats with whiskers that tickle, bears ambling around the garden, and children jumping in rain puddles – You, O God, made all this and much more. You imagined a good life for all people. You gifted us with a planet where the sun and the rain dance together to sustain biodiversity. And you whispered in human ears stories of hope and faith that open our eyes to the beauty of creation and the goodness of life.

Humanity has not always been thankful for life or for the Earth. So you sent Jesus, your Child, to remind us of the joy that fills our heart when we love our neighbors. Jesus inspired his followers to find joy in small things like in the taste of bread and juice.
