

Today - UCC Zimbabwe Visitor Sitshengisiwe Tsododo Today – Mission Trip to Greece Presentation October 22<sup>nd</sup> – Book Group Meeting October 28<sup>th</sup> – Paulo's Last Sunday Worship with Reception to Follow **UCC Zimbabwe** – **Today, October 21<sup>st</sup>**, PCUCC will welcome Sitshengisiwe Tsododo, a member of the UCC Zimbabwe delegation visiting New Hampshire. Yesterday, **October 20<sup>th</sup>**, she attended the NHUCC Annual Meeting. Mrs. Tsododo, an occupational health nurse, is from Ivene Church in Gweru, Zimbabwe partnered with South Newbury Union Church. She is married and has an 18 year old son and 14 year old daughter. Also, she is the Chair of the UCCZ Western Conference Ukama Partnership, and is a member of Ruwadzano (Women's Fellowship) and the Volunteer Council.

**Mission Trip** – **Today, October 21**<sup>st</sup>, there will be an informal power point presentation on the Mission Trip to Greece during Coffee Hour. We hope you will be able to stay and learn more about our travels and experiences working with Perichoresis and the refugee children and families.
