

Sharing the Light of Christ: Letting Our Light Shine

Christ was born in the infant, Jesus. And that child whose birth we remember on this evening grew up to show the world the way to salvation...becoming a light to the world. Christ lived in Jesus, and Christ can live in us. Christ inspires our hope, nurtures our faith, encourages our love, enkindles our peace, and sustains our joy. Christ has shown us the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Christ gives light in the midst of darkness, and passes that light on to us so that we may be a shining light in the night...a light of hope, a light of faith, a light of love, a light of peace, and a light of joy - - for all the world to see.

When we are lit by love's pure light, we respond with acts of generosity and spiritual grace. Our individual lights shine like flames of a candle. But when we shine together as a community of the faithful, our collective light is able to radiate like a lighthouse's beacon to a world in need. Let us as that community affirm our commitment to help heal a world in need of Christ's light of love as we let our lights shine.

(As we sing the following hymn, the pastor takes the flame from the Christ Candle and lights the candle of the 1st person in each section, who then lights the candle of the person next to them, repeating the pattern till the end of each row. The last person on the row will then pass the flame on to the row behind them, and thus the flamed is weaved throughout the congregation from front to back until everyone's candle is lit. Symbolically, we all receive and pass on the light of Christ. Please tip only unlit candles to receive the flame from those lit.)
