

The beginning of the prelude is an invitation to silent, personal preparation for the worship of God.

Call to Worship

One: Come into the presence of the One who makes holy every place, every space, holy and sacred.

All: Even where we continue to stay safe in our homes, the doors of grace are flung wide open for us.

One: Come and hear the stories of the One who loves you.

All: In living rooms, on laptops and devices, we will sing our songs and tell those tales of the peace and of the hope which are ours.

Gathering Prayer

One: What is our hope? Simply put, it is that God has not abandoned us. With such good news, we can dare to bring our prayers to the One who will not cast aside our words or our hearts. Let us pray:

All: We must tell you, God who knows us better than we think, how easy it is to put our trust in those who offer easy fixes, quick solutions, cures and tests and false hope in these days. It is easier to believe the glib words of politicians, the conspiracies of all the theorists, rather than those who are rational and share with us the truth of what we are facing. All too easily, we can buy into the notion that the economy is more important than safety, that jobs matter more than the I lives of the most vulnerable, that our so-called rights trump the need to be a community of compassion and grace. Forgive us, God of mercy. You are not found in political rhetoric, but in the child who holds our hand. You are not a simple tweet, but the Word that can transform our very lives. You are not a disembodied, constantly recalculating voice, but the One who calls us to life by following Jesus, in whose name we pray. Amen.
