

One: Let Your love be revealed through our worship and our lives.


All: Let us recall that we are the Body of Christ in the world, deeply connected to Your wisdom.

Children and youth are welcome to come forward during the message for all ages if they like. The message for all ages will truly be intergenerational this morning so if children want to stay in the pews that is okay too!




