

Though we have frayed the fabric of Your making, Tearing away from all that You intend, Yet, to be whole, humanity is aching – Come, work with us, and weave us into one.



The Hope Fund of our church continues to touch the lives of people in the Lakes Region. This summer we purchased food for people, assisted fa5milies who needed back to school supplies, assisted folks with rental expenses as well as utilities. When we assisted families in preparation for school, we actually were able to meet a few of the children impacted; they were immensely grateful. We have deep gratitude for all of those who have contributed money and time related to the Hope Fund.
