One: Power on earth has no power with God; with God, the hungry are fed and the blind see clearly.


All: Spirit – bring about life and love in us this hour. Remind us to whom we belong and for what purpose we exist.


One: Even we who are needy will be brought to our call – those of us who struggle will find a seat of honor *in* a seat of humility.
