



News From the Racial Justice Team

In our Racial Justice work we have been challenged to examine the unconscious racial messages our church sends. We are asked to look at our church with the eyes of a visitor who is a Person of Color.

That question made us uncomfortable, as it should. Would a Person of Color feel welcome in our midst? What images do they see on our walls, or in our bulletins? Or hear in our prayers?

It made us realize that we need to make a public witness to the diversity that we so aspire to and that Jesus calls us to. One simple and inexpensive way to do that would be to create a display area close to our Peace Pole in front of the church for different signs promoting social justice issues. We will begin with a Black Lives Matter yard sign and plan to change it up every month to keep it fresh and interesting. Council approved placement of this sign. We are also contacting the Town Office to find out the Town's requirements for larger signs.

There is much work still to be done, but we hope this one small step will help us make a difference. We welcome your ideas for creating a more welcoming environment in our church.

Our Director/s of Faith Formation positions are opening! We are seeking someone who is interested in faithfully leading our children and youth; we begin our search in house because theological fit is important.
