Maundy Thursday Service of Tenebrae March 28, 2024: 7 pm



The service of Tenebrae (from the Latin word for shadows) is an ancient ritual commemorating Jesus' final hours. As scripture is read, candles are extinguished until the sanctuary is left in darkness.

The candles represent the twelve disciples who, each in their own way, betrayed, denied, or abandoned their teacher and leader. The Christ candle at the center of the table symbolizes the presence of Christ, even in the darkest of times. Prelude
